1. Did you read all the scripture you were assigned? What did God Teach you? What are you doing about it?
2. Did you use your voice this week to give testimony to the greatness and grace of Jesus Christ?
3. What one sin plagued you in your walk this week?  
(Use the Seven Deadly Sins as your guide: Pride, Envy, Gluttony, Lust, Anger, Greed, and Sloth)
4. What good thing did you enjoy to excess that kept your from devoting yourself to better things?
5. How well did you do at loving difficult people this week?  
Use 1 Cor 13:4-6 as your standard: "Love is kind and patient never jealous boastful, proud or rude. Love isn't selfish or quick tempered. It doesn't keep a record of wrongs that others do."
6. Have you demonstrated a servants heart this week? If so how?
7. Did you pray this week for those on the Strategic Prayer Focus list?
8. Have you suffered in any way this week due to your unwavering commitment to the Lordship of Christ?

## Frequently Asked Questions:

### 1. How do I join a LTT?

*You may start your own LTT by inviting one or two other people to join you or you may join an existing group that has an opening.*

### 2. How do I start an LTT?

*LTT's are lead by the Holy spirit You can begin your own by asking one or two others to join you. Individuals forming a group might commit to an LTT for a specified time e.g. 3-6 months. At the end of that time group members may recommit or decide to disband.*

### 3. What does the LTT typically do?

*The character-building questions stimulate conversation. Some time is also spent talking about the week's Bible reading. Often questions arise or new insights can be shared. Finally, the group spends some time praying for one another and for the two or three not-yet-followers of Jesus. The success of an LTT depends on the level of trust developed between the participants. Absolute commitment to confidentiality will allow for sharing, accountability, intimacy, and true life transformations.*

### 4. Why is the group size limited to 2 or 3 people?

*There are several reasons for keeping the group small. First, in a one hour meeting there just isn't time to allow each member of the group to share their answers to the accountability questions and to have time to discuss the Bible reading if the group is larger than three. Second, developing trust and confidentiality is important in an LTT and easier to maintain with a group of two or three people of the same gender.*

### 5. What happens if our group grows larger than three people?

*When a fourth member is added to the LTT, the group should divide and multiply. That is, a group of four will divide into two groups of two. Each of these groups may invite a third person to join and the LTT will multiply.*

## Life Transformation Triad

A Life Transformation Triad is a way of obeying Jesus' command to make and multiply disciples without relying on trained leaders. Three people who desire to grow in Christ seek to hear from God through confession, prayer and scripture reading. They can encourage and support one another in obeying what they hear from God. They can also agree in prayer for salvation of loved ones.

A Life Transformation Triad typically meets once a week for an hour. It is gender specific (not co-ed), requires no curriculum or special training.



# There are three tasks to be accomplished in a Life Transformation Triad.

## 1. Sin is confessed in mutual accountability.



LTTs begin by asking each other the Christlike Character Questions LTTs start here because it is easy to lose focus and talk only about *safer* things. Beginning with confession of sin tends to sanctify the rest of the gathering. The questions are asked in a safe environment that values honesty, vulnerability, confidentiality and grace.

Each person takes a turn answering the same question before moving on to the next. The others listen and avoid trying to “fix each other”, but instead pray for one another. The confession of sin to each other, is commanded by the Scriptures (James 5:16)

## 2. Scripture is read repetitively, in context and in community.



Each group selects a book of the Bible to read through. The number of chapters read should range from 15 to 20 chapters per week. If the Group is reading a book of the bible with fewer chapters - e.g. James - they may agree to read the book through three or four times in one week. Once you have set the group goal the group stays on the reading assignment until everyone

completes the entire reading in one week. Sometimes this means a group will re-read the same passage for several weeks. The pay-off is that you are getting more familiar with the bible.

Use a notebook as a journal, read the scriptures assigned and record special insights from the Lord. The goal of the reading is not intense study; it is to hear from God and do what He says, for this is the definition of faith.

## 3. Not-yet-followers of Jesus are prayed for specifically and regularly.



Each member of the LTT is to identify three people locally and one or two people groups globally, who the Lord lays on their hearts because they need Jesus. The names of these people/people groups are then written down on the cards of every member of the group. Each person in the group prays throughout the week for those on the list as well as during your meeting time.

## Is there a way to do this with my spouse or family?

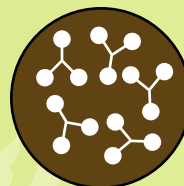

Yes, Multiple triads can come together to form a larger Life Transformation Group (LTG). Husbands, wives and others meet and mix together usually in a home for social time then break up into gender specific triads. (see Fig. A)
